



WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO:

APPAREL

- Hat and sun glasses
- Wet/Dry Shoes (for wet landings)
- Sturdy, comfortable walking shoes or lightweight hiking boots
- Bathing suits (at least 2)
- Neutral-colored clothing
- Lightweight shorts or pants
- Lightweight rain jacket
- A sweater or jacket for cooler evenings
- Evenings are casual. No need for formal attire.

DON'T FORGET

- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Small backpack to carry essentials while ashore
- Camera & plenty of memory cards
- Underwater camera
- A re-sealable plastic bag to prevent water damage to cameras and other electronics
- Any personal medication

DOUBLE CHECK

- Passport - Ecuadorian law requires that your passport be valid for at least 6 months after the return date
- Celebrity Cruises or my travel agent has received your flight details
- Celebrity Cruises or my travel agent knows your dietary needs
- Celebrity Cruises or my travel agent knows about any special celebrations

INSIDER TIPS

Quito, Ecuador

- Quito is known as the world's highest capital at 9,350 feet. Upon arrival it is important to take it easy, stay well hydrated and eat light meals.

Galapagos Islands

- The climate in the Galapagos Islands is warm in the daytime with cool evenings. It is important to protect yourself from the sun and stay hydrated at all times.
- The terrain in the Galapagos varies from lava fields to sandy beaches so always watch your step and use the walking sticks provided when needed.
- When deciding what to pack keep one word in mind: practicality.
- SPF long sleeve shirts, pants that zip at the knees and dry fit clothing are all great to have

NOTE

All guests must ensure they are medically fit for travel. Please note the ability to accommodate guests with special needs aboard the vessels in the Galapagos Islands is limited. The Galapagos vessels cannot accommodate guests who are full-time wheelchair users. In addition, the land portion of these vacations, including Quito and Galapagos in Ecuador, as well as Lima, Cuzco and Machu Picchu in Peru are not suited to persons who are full-time wheelchair users. A guest on a Celebrity Galapagos vacation must be able to ascend or descend steps into a motor coach, walk and/or climb over uneven ground for extended distances, get on and off Zodiacs on both wet and dry landings, and, since there are no elevators on-board the ships, be able to climb stairs. Celebrity Galapagos vessels do not offer accessible staterooms.

Travel Insurance with medical and evacuation coverage for Galapagos is a government requirement and guests may be asked to show printed or digital proof upon arrival in Baltra. CruiseCare Travel Protection provides the necessary coverage.
