### Whale Watching and Marine Mammals Cruise

Join a welcoming crew as you embark on a dynamic high-speed boat ride around Icy Strait Point, searching for whales and relishing coastal Alaskan scenery. Enjoy cool ocean breezes atop the open-air observation deck, where an expert naturalist explains the behaviors and migration patterns of area cetaceans. Journey to one of the most active whale feeding spots in Alaska, where you'll look for breaching humpback whales, sea lions, and soaring eagles.

#### Whales, Wildlife and Brown Bear Search

Discover Icy Strait Point's abundant wildlife population, as you embark on a high-speed catamaran whale-watching ride before trekking on foot around the bear-laden Spasski River. Enjoy coastal scenery as you cruise around picturesque Point Adolphus, one of Alaska's most active whale feeding locations, while spotting breaching humpback whales. Set out on foot through Spasski River valley's bush country pathways, learning about the area's ecology and potentially encountering Alaskan coastal brown bears and perched bald eagles.

#### Whale Watching and ZipRider Combo

Experience the best of Icy Strait Point on a tour that combines whale watching with a thrilling ride on the world's largest ZipRider. Be swept away on a whale watching excursion where you are guaranteed to see at least one whale or you will receive refund for the whale watching portion of the tour. After, enjoy a scenic drive through the quaint fishing village of Hoonah on your way 1,550 feet up the mountainside to begin your ZipRider adventure. Taller than the Empire State Building, this is the only ZipRider anywhere with 6 cables, so you can race down with your family and friends. Take in the spectacular views before flying back to sea level at speeds exceeding 60 miles per hour. Next, relish our famous Crabby Bloody Mary (a non-alcoholic version is also available) or other beverage of your choice while you explore Icy Strait Point on your own.

#### Taku Lodge Feast and 5-Glacier Seaplane





### Mendenhall Glacier by Helicopter & Dog Sledding

Begin by boarding a helicopter and taking off into the crisp Alaskan sky. Look out to see snow-capped peaks and dense-green rainforest below. Your destination is the surface of the Mendenhall Glacier, a 12-mile-long protected area within the Tongass National Forest. Feel the amazing sensation as you hover over the Mendenhall Glacier and slowly descend for a perfect landing. Step out and marvel at the frozen landscape. Meet up with a group of expert mushers, and, oh say, 300 energetic Alaskan Huskies, to learn the ins and outs of the state's favorite and furriest sport. Snap photos with the irresistible crowd of canines, and then experience the thrill of a lifetime. Just sit back and enjoy the ride.





Begin with a panoramic drive through the Mendenhall Valley to Auke Bay, where you'll board a waterjet-powered catamaran for a whale-watching cruise. This is prime whale watching territory. In fact, in 15 years, this crew has never failed to sight whales. They're so confident, in fact, that If you don't spot a whale, they guarantee a \$100 cash refund. You're most likely to spend time viewing the world famous Humpback Whales and sleek Killer Whales. Afterwards, enjoy a narrated drive to Mendenhall Glacier. Trek along scenic viewing trails for incredible photo opportunities, and learn about the awesome force of glaciers from Forest Service experts at the Mendenhall Visitor Center.

#### Misty Fjords and Wilderness Explorer

Delight in Ketchikan's spectacular natural scenery as you embark on a dynamic boat ride through the unspoiled wilderness of the famous Misty Fjords National Monument. Learn about the area's natural history and enjoy snacks and beverages onboard the vessel, where you can watch a Native storytelling presentation and informative video. Travel along Behm Canal to expansive Rudyerd Bay, where you'll see the striking New Eddystone Rock while spotting bald eagles, whales, and other native wildlife.

#### A Great Alaskan Lumberjack Show

Raw, lively and highly entertaining history comes alive at The Great Alaskan Lumberjack Show & Competition. The cheering & heckles become roars of excitement as the two rugged teams of Champion Lumberjacks compete in chopping, sawing, tree climbing, log rolling and axe throwing with music and lore. This Historic Show is located along the old harbor and Red Light district just blocks from the pier and is viewed in the comfort of covered, cushioned grandstands.


#### Wilderness Exploration and Crab Feast

Discover Ketchikan's breathtaking natural sights and tasty flavors at the historic George Inlet Lodge. Begin your tour with scenic drive to the lodge and encounter canneries, an old sawmill, and decorative totem poles. #### White Pass Scenic Railway

Listen along as your guide shares tales of the Klondike Gold Rush and construction of the 19th century narrow gauge railroad. Admire picturesque views of sprawling White Pass and its towering 2,800-foot summit.

### Liarsville Gold Rush Trail Camp and Salmon Bake

Discover the rich bounties from Skagway, sea and land, on a salmon bake and gold rush camp adventure. Begin with an all-you-can-eat alfresco feast in the forest that features wild Alaskan salmon, slow-grilled over a fragrant alder wood fire. When your taste buds are satisfied, mosey on over to the Liarsville Gold Rush Trail Camp. Enjoy a waterfall, authentic exhibits and entertainment, as well as the chance to pan for gold.


#### Adventure Park and Zip Lines

Experience a different type of Skagway rush, the kind that is only discovered as you zipline through sky-high treetops. After a narrated drive through Skagway and up the Klondike Highway, take a short nature hike to the Adventure Park. Gear up and then join expert guides on an adrenaline-pumping thrill ride. Walk on raised balance beams, cross suspension bridges, and race through the fresh mountain air on a series of six ziplines.

## Alaska Raptor Center and Cultural Discovery

At the Alaska Raptor Center, you'll learn how bald eagles, hawks, owls and other birds of prey are rescued and rehabilitated and watch as they regain their flight abilities at The Flight Training Center. A stroll through the scenic coastal trails in Sitka National Historical Park takes you deep into the forest full of spruce and hemlock and stately Tlingit and Haida totem poles. When you visit Centennial Hall, Sitka's Russian heritage comes alive. Archangel Dancers perform ethnic folk dances and songs. Your tour continues to St. Michael's Cathedral, a traditional Russian Orthodox Church, where you'll see its beautiful inlay work in gold as well as its dome, cross, and bell tower.

#### Best of Sitka

Among the evergreen tree canopy of Tongass National Forest, you'll stand on a covered viewing platform at the Fortress of the Bear, an animal rescue center where you'll get within 25 feet of orphaned brown bears living in their natural element. Moving on to the Sitka National Historical Park, you'll relive the Battle of 1804 watching Tlingit artists hand-carve intricate totem poles in the traditional way. Finally, the Alaska Raptor Center equally impresses with its outside deck habitats where rescued birds of prey are rehabilitated. You'll even see a professional handler interact with a wild bald eagle, gazing in awe as it soars around the flight center in the most majestic of ways.

### Wildlife Quest Cruise & Fin Island Lodge

Take a seat in the cabin of a purpose-built catamaran, as an experienced captain navigates the cold waters of Sitka Sound. Your onboard naturalist shares insight into Alaska's vibrant ecosystem while pointing out natural landmarks. You might even see a whale, sea otter or brown bear in the distance. Then step off onto Fin Island where you will indulge in an authentic Alaskan meal. Crab, alder wood-grilled salmon, prime rib, homemade sides and desserts round out the day's menu. When you've had your fill, enjoy a bit of free time to wander along the shore, purchase souvenirs in the gift shop, or relax fireside with a cocktail.

#### **Butchart and Butterfly Gardens**

Spend your day surrounded by vivid and vibrant color with a tour to Victoria Island's famed Butchart and Butterfly Gardens. Meander along trails that lead you through an incredible 55-acres of landscaped perfection at Butchart Gardens. See the Rose Gardens, Italian Gardens, Japanese Gardens and legendary Sunken Gardens. Later, stroll beneath flittering wings of color at Butterfly Garden. You'll see pink flamingoes and tropical birds, as well. You might even see a butterfly sleeping!
